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CHURCH PENSION GROUP SHARES INSIGHTS ON EPISCOPAL CLERGY

2024 Clergy Compensation Report Now Includes Data on Parish Deacons

NEW YORK, NY—August 11, 2025—[The Church Pension Group](#) (CPG), a financial services organization that serves The Episcopal Church, today released its interactive 2024 Episcopal Clergy Compensation Report (cpg.org/clergy-compensation-report), offering insights into the compensation and demographics of Episcopal clergy. This year's report now includes data on parish deacons, data from the unified dioceses of the Great Lakes and Wisconsin, and a "working hours" demographic statistics category to better describe the full- and part-time categories.

Among the key findings:

- The median compensation for full-time clergy is now approximately \$94,000, a 4% increase since 2023.
- Part-time* clergy comprise approximately 20% of compensated clergy.
- The median compensation for part-time clergy is approximately \$33,000.
- The number of female bishops continues to increase.
- The majority (68%) of parish deacons are female.

** Part-time is defined as working fewer than 1,500 hours per year. Full-time is defined as working 1,500 hours per year or more.*
