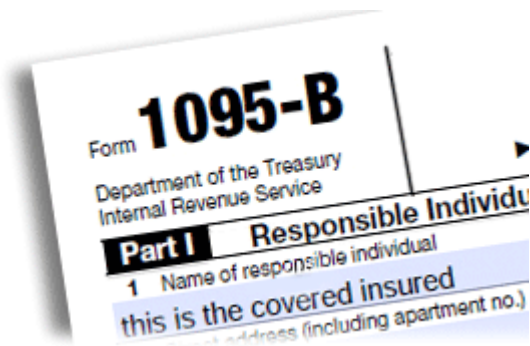


IRS Extends Due Date to Issue Health Coverage Forms to Individuals in 2020

Are you looking for your Form 1095-B?

It will be mailed to you no later than March 2, 2020



On December 2, 2019, the Internal Revenue Service announced the extended due date for the 2019 information reporting required under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA). Insurers, self-insuring employers, other coverage providers, and applicable large employers now have until March 2, 2020, to provide Form 1095-B and Form 1095-C to individuals. This is a 30-day extension from the original due date of January 31, 2020.

What is Form 1095-B used for?

Form 1095-B is used to report certain information to the IRS and to taxpayers about individuals who are covered by qualifying health care coverage called minimum essential coverage. The IRS requires the Episcopal Church Medical Trust (Medical Trust) to provide Form 1095-B to all members enrolled in Medical Trust self-funded plans.

When will I receive Form 1095-B?

The Medical Trust will utilize the extended due date for the 2019 information reporting period and issue Form 1095-B to all members by March 2, 2020.

What if I don't receive my Form 1095-B?

The form will be mailed no later than March 2, 2020, and may take some time to reach you.
