


Five Trends

Non-linear compensation patterns




Blurred line between active and retired

Older average age than priests


Higher percentage female





Rapid Growth of Religiously Unaffiliated


Adults, in millions

% of each generation who identify their religion as atheist, agnostic or nothing in particular



Which of the following statements comes closest to describing your views about the Bible?


- % Actual word of God to be taken literally

Views of Origin of Human Beings






