

She also serves as a member of the Board of Trustees of The Church Pension Fund, CPG's governing body.

Mary Kate has served in a variety of leadership positions in the corporate, legal, and government sectors. Prior to joining CPG, she was a senior finance executive and principal corporate officer of Wyeth, one of the world's largest pharmaceutical companies. Before embarking on her corporate career, she was a partner and chaired the tax practice group of Shearman & Sterling, a leading global law firm. Earlier in her career, she served in the Office of Tax Policy of the United States Department of the Treasury.

She chairs the board of the Church Benefits Association, a national association of faith-based benefits organizations, and she serves on the vestry of Trinity Church Wall Street and on its investment committee, which oversees the institution's \$5 billion real estate and securities portfolio. She is a former director and chair of a publicly traded medical device company. Mary Kate's professional affiliations include membership in the Women's Forum of New York and Women Corporate Directors.

Mary Kate spent her childhood in Bottineau, North Dakota, a small rural community on the Canadian border. She graduated from Hamline University in St. Paul, Minnesota, *summa cum laude* with a BA in English and Theater, and was elected a member of Phi Beta Kappa. She later graduated *cum laude* from the University of Michigan Law School.

## Dr. Jerry Park Associate Professor of Sociology and Affiliate Fellow Baylor Institute for Studies of Religion

Dr. Jerry Park is an associate professor of sociology and an affiliate fellow of the Baylor Institute for Studies of Religion. He graduated from the University of Virginia with a psychology degree and earned his master's and PhD degrees from the University of Notre Dame. His research interests include the sociological study of religion, race, identity, culture and civic participation. Recent publications have covered topics such as religion and workplace attitudes, religious attitudes of academic scientists, Asian-American religiosity, and religious media consumption. Currently his research focuses on attitudes toward racial and religious minorities. His undergraduate teaching is in the sociology of racial and ethnic inequalities, and at the graduate level, he teaches seminars on the sociology of culture and religion, and the sociology of race, gender, and religion. He serves as associate editor for the Journal for the Scientific Study of Religion and is an editorial board member for Social Psychology Quarterly.



## Dr. Matthew Price Senior Vice President for Research & Data Church Pension Group

Dr. Matthew Price serves as Senior Vice President for Research & Data at CPG. In addition to leading the team responsible for our role as the Recorder of Ordinations, he is responsible for collecting insights that help inform CPG's decisions around major policy initiatives in the area of retirement and health benefits and is also involved in technical system launches and integrations. He joined CPG in June 2001 as its Director of Analytical Research.

Prior to joining CPG, he was Associate Director, Duke Pastoral Leadership Project, at the J. Ormond Center of the Duke University Divinity School. Previously, he was a Research Associate with the Religion in Urban America Program at the University of Illinois at Chicago. His background also includes teaching positions at Duke, North Carolina State, and the University of Illinois at Chicago.

He received a BA in sociology from the London School of Economics, an MA in history from the University of Sussex, and a PhD in sociology from Princeton.
